American Gateways, Austin: Students will assist attorneys and accredited representatives in a variety of immigration matters, including deferred action for childhood arrivals, temporary protected status, U-Visas, and asylum. Students may have an opportunity to visit the Immigration Court in San Antonio to observe a hearing or the T. Don Hutto immigration detention center in Taylor, TX to assist in pro se workshops. Spanish language proficiency is an asset, but not required."
<u>Dallas Volunteer Attorney Program</u> , <i>Dallas</i> : In-office assistance with staffing cases and various administrative tasks, along with interviewing applicants at legal clinics and assisting with CLE and recruiting events outside of our office.
KIND Houston: bilingual student in Spanish required. KIND works to protect unaccompanied children wherever they are in their journeys through legal services, public education and outreach, and reintegration support for children returning alone from the U.S. to their home countries.

Week 2 March 14-18, 2016 Aid to Victims of Domestic Violence, Houston: Students will be paired with an attorney/paralegal
team. They will shadow the team. They will have the opportunity to sit in on new client intake, appear alongside the attorney at any court proceedings and mediations scheduled for the week they spend at AVDA. Further students will participate in services by drafting letters, making client telephone calls where appropriate. Finally students will have first-hand observations of the aforementioned services the Legal Advocacy Program provides at AVDA.
<u>Dallas Volunteer Attorney Program</u> , <i>Dallas</i> : In-office assistance with staffing cases and various administrative tasks, along with interviewing applicants at legal clinics and assisting with CLE and recruiting events outside of our office.
<u>Disability Rights Texas</u> , <i>Houston</i> ; Provide assistance to Education Team attorneys in Houston who represent children with disabilities in special education, foster care, and juvenile justice related disputes.
