\_\_\_\_\_ If I am selected and accepted as a participant in the ATJIP, I understand and agree I have made a personal and professional commitment to participate and will not withdraw from the program without the express written permission of the Texas Access to Justice Commission.

\_\_\_\_\_ I understand I will be issued a 1099 at the end of the year and the stipend I earn is considered taxable income. I am responsible for ascertaining my own tax liability. I further understand that if my internship covers two taxable years, I will receive a 1099 at the end of each taxable year.
